Academy Soccer General Information

Uniform Ordering |

ORYA's Academy program requires a uniform which is NOT part of your program tuition. This will be an additional cost of \$15. Your uniform can be used from season to season, so you only need to purchase a uniform if you are new to the program or otherwise need a new uniform. If your uniform fits from last season you don't need a new one!

All uniforms ordered before the deadline of August 1st will be shipped to the ORYA office (to save on individual shipping costs) for you to pick up locally at our office in Durham or at the field prior to your first session.

Program Description |

This program steps up to twice per week sessions with a mid-week practice day and a Saturday morning 'game' day. Players continue to develop skills through fun games and exercises that incorporate their imaginations to get them excited about specific exercises they're being introduced to. Saturdays turn into fun, non-result based 'games' where small sided play is the focus. Game day offers players an introduction to soccer competition in an in-house environment where quality of play and building on what was learned at practice is the judgement of success.

Program Description

ORYA's last completely in-house program offers twice per week practices and in-house games on Saturdays. Players begin to experience more structured practice sessions where building technical skills & small sided play are more overtly apparent. Fun games and exercises are still utilized to peak interest and build skills, but coaches begin to increase expectations and build towards individual skill & small sided play milestones. Saturday games are still non-result based with success still being judged on the quality of play within the game rather than the end result.

Optional |

For those interested in experiencing a little bit of what travel soccer is like you have the option to show your interest in a free travel option for U10 players. The number of games each player receives is largely dependent on how many players opt in. If numbers end up being too few for two teams but a little too many for one team, preference will be given to 2010 birth year players since they will be moving to travel soccer next fall.

Some travel games are home and some are away - of varying distance. Usually 4 home and 4 away within a regular season. Games usually take place on Saturday afternoons or Saturday mornings. Players choosing to experience some travel games will still be required to participate in the regular, in-house Academy program. However, you would receive the added benefit of playing in a few 'real' games against other towns. These games, like the Academy season itself, would begin around early September and end around the end of October.

Please note: Any child interested in this travel option must be signed up no later than Aug. 1st.

Academy Soccer Tuition Information

Player Tuition |

The tuition for this program accounts for insurance (medical & liability), equipment budget, program balls, ORYA Admin & Capital Fund allocations, online payment processing & merchant account fees, Porto-potties at each location used for soccer, field lining paint, field maintenance which may include mowing, irrigation-related costs, fertilization schedule, spot treatments, aeration, etc., league related fees for applicable age groups, a small stipend for coach education or skills coaches, background checks, safe sport certifications annual Teamsnap fees and field lining paint.

ORYA Admin |

This encompasses all expenses of which most are non-sport specific and allow the organization to operate. The admin portion of player fees go toward ORYA employee salaries, workers compensation & Board liability insurance, bookkeeping & accounting services, temporary/intern staff stipends, office equipment & supplies, employer paid taxes, payroll service fees, employee benefits, postage, printing & reproduction, advertising, IT support & computer services, service subscriptions & annual dues, telephone, internet, web hosting, web support, bank charges, business travel & meals, charitable contributions, mileage/toll/parking reimbursements and other items from year to year.

ORYA Board Dedicated Savings |

ORYA's Board Designated Savings supports new initiatives, large scale programs, and/or facility improvements. The Capital Fund is sustained by donations, grants, and program registration fees. The Capital Fund ensures ORYA's steady growth and, over time, investment in larger projects. All of ORYA's programs benefit from the Capital Fund. Expenditures from ORYA's Capital Fund must support the organization's mission and be approved by the Board of Directors. ORYA admin fees will only count towards those that are a part of a full ORYA team.

Why are player fees presented differently this season? |

ORYA has re-evaluated its player fee budgeting process, to include total town funding contributions in the equation. Taking into account each town's expected number of participants, current funding and in-kind donations, such as field and office space, ORYA has created a new budgeting approach. This new approach reflects a rate that correlates directly to the individual town's total contribution per participant.

Travel Soccer General Information

Fall Age Groups | 2009-2005 Birth Years (U11-U15)

Travel is very similar to our U10 Academy program with the addition of games against other teams! Your familiar volunteer coaches continue to focus on fun and development with gradual emphasis on team shape, basic tactics and a positive team environment.

Our fall travel program offers players the opportunity to compete in the NHSL or NNESL town-travel-based and local, club level leagues. Our no-cut approach creates birth year-based teams and utilizes dedicated, volunteer coaches in a fun learning environment. Some teams may participate in a Columbus Day tournament depending on player and coach availability and some birth years may be combined based upon final registration numbers.

After our registration deadline volunteer coordinators will communicate with all registered players to introduce their volunteer coach(es), the make-up of their team and what league they will be participating in.

Practices & Games |

You can expect to practices on a Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday schedule depending on your volunteer coach availability but we do our best to try and avoid program conflicts when possible. Practices may start as early as the week of August 19th if your coaches and majority of your team are available. Sessions take place at Tibbetts Field or Little River Park depending on their age and field size.

Games are held over the course of 6-8 weeks, weather dependent, and roughly half are home and half are away. Games are typically scheduled for Saturdays later in the afternoon.

Uniform Ordering

ORYA's Travel Soccer program requires a uniform which is NOT part of your program tuition. Uniform information will be sent to each team following the registration deadline.

League Rostering |

In order to roster your player with the appropriate governing body and league ORYA will require proof of birth as well as an updated headshot each fall. In addition, depending on which league each team is placed in, a liability waiver may also be required. Once each player is rostered and required items are submitted for verification each player is issued a player card which is used prior to every game for the referee to confirm each players' eligibility.
